

## From the Pastor's Desk

**July 2021** 

I stumbled over a scripture that spoke to me in regards to the month of July this year as we are coming out of isolation during the pandemic. 1 Peter 5: 7-10 says, "Throw all your anxiety onto him, because he cares about you. Be clearheaded. Keep alert. Your accuser, the devil, is on the prowl like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith. Others should be sensitive and support you in this.

Father James Martin, SJ, a Jesuit priest and spiritual guide, has authored an instructional book called, "Learning to Pray: A Guide for Everyone. ### **Online Giving**

For your convenience, the church now has a PayPal account for online giving. To access online giving, go to the church website (ebucc.com) and use the donate button. Please be aware the PayPal charges a 30 cent transaction fee and a 2.9% handling fee for each donation. For example, if you donate \$50 to the church, PayPal charges \$1.75 (.30 transaction fee plus \$1.45 handling fee) and the church will receive \$48.25. Therefore, if you plan on using online giving, I recommend you donate once a month to minimize the transaction fee. I will be accessing the PayPal account once a month to produce the giving report for your annual giving statement and transfer funds to the church account. You can designate your donation to the various funds such as Current, OCWM, Capital fund in the notes. I will distribute your funds according to your designation. If there is no note, the funds will go to the current operating fund.
