Consistory Meeting: Consistory will meet on Tuesday, October 1, 2024 at 6:30 p.m. in the parsonage.

Baust Literary Group (October): Next meeting is Tuesday, October 29, at 6 pm. "*West with Giraffes,* "by Lynda Rutledge is a novel that combines adventure, history, and coming-of-age themes. The story is inspired by real events that took place in 1938, when two giraffes were transported from Kenya to the San Diego Zoo after surviving a hurricane and crossing the Atlantic. The book follows the giraffes and their journey across the country in a makeshift wooden crate on the back of a truck, driven by a young Dust Bowl rowdy named Woodrow. The story also features a fictional character, Woodrow Wilson Nickel, who narrates the story as a 105-year-old man in 2025, looking back on the experience he had when he was 17.

The story weaves together real and fictional characters, including the world's first female zoo director, a young female photographer, and other reprobates. It also explores themes of how animals, strangers, and the passage of time can change people, and the importance of telling stories before it's too late. Some reviewers say the book is believable and enjoyable, and that it kept them wanting more.

Neighbors in Need Special Mission Offering: In 2024, the Neighbors in Need theme is "Mental Health Justice For All!" This year's focus is on Mental Health Justice. In 2015, the General Synod of the United Church of Christ passed a resolution to become WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged) for mental health. A just world for all is a world where the human rights and wellbeing of people with mental health challenges are respected, no matter who you are or where you are in life's mental health journey. Please join us in promoting this year's NIN "Mental Health is a Universal Human Right" campaign at your church. As you may recall, one-third of the offering supports Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds are used by Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants to UCC churches and organizations as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. EBUCC will be collecting for NIN during the month of October and will start promoting in worship on October 6, 2024, as part of World Wide Communion Sunday. We thank you for your continued support and generosity to this 5 for5 special UCC offering.




