Dear members and friends of Emmanuel Baust United Church of Christ,

As members of the Search Committee, we want to express our gratitude for the trust you have placed in us. Over the last two years, we have prayerfully journeyed together through the process of reviewing profiles and interviewing candidates, ultimately arriving at our decision. We are pleased to recommend to you our candidate for the position of Pastor, to be considered by the congregation at a special meeting on Sunday, March 30, 2025, following worship. We invite you to a casual meet and greet on Saturday, March 29, between 10 am and 12 pm. We will have light refreshments.

We are grateful to our Conference Minister, Rev Sheresa Simpson-Rice, who worked closely with us during this process. We also remember our dear friend and first search committee chair, Mike Paxton, for all his efforts as we started this journey.

To review the steps that led us to this point of confidence:

- 1. Our church's profile was updated and refreshed, to be more current, reflective of our church, and appealing to candidates.
- 2. Our vacancy was listed in UCC Ministry Opportunities and in a publication for retired armed forces chaplains. We also utilized local networks and directed any interested candidates to the conference.
- 3. Persons authorized to complete a UCC Ministerial Profile submitted their profile through the conference office. These profiles had information about the candidates' sense of calling, formation for ministry, faith and leadership experience, references, and an ethical self-disclosure form, and a criminal background check.
- 4. We received profiles, invited several candidates to participate in interviews and three were asked to preach at a neutral pulpit.
- 5. Following each neutral pulpit, we sough God's guidance and prayerfully considered each candidate. We were glad when our top candidate responded enthusiastically to our invitation for a candidating weekend. In addition, the Search Committee prepared a formal call agreement.
- 6. Confidentiality has been essential to our process, and we now ask you to keep in close confidence the candidate's name until such a time as the congregational vote is affirmative and we have the candidate's consent to publish the news of their call ministry with us.
- 7. Our candidate is Reverend Roger W. Wilmer, Jr.

8. We invite you to a casual meet and greet on Saturday March 29, between 10 and 12, and in worship on Sunday March 30, when Reverend Wilmer will lead worship and preach. A congregational meeting will follow the service and will offer the opportunity for each church member to ask questions of the Search Committee and to vote on the call for our new pastor.

We have been grateful during this two-year search process for many people, including Reverend Herb Ruby, who served as our interim pastor, and our church members who ensured our pulpit was never empty. In addition, we thank Revered Dan Summers, Reverend Jeffery Dull, and Reverend Andy Hood for the many Sundays they led us in worship.

Again, we encourage you to attend the informal meet and greet on Saturday the 29<sup>th</sup> and worship service on the 30<sup>th</sup> to hear more from the search committee as we present our candidate to you.

We are blessed with a supportive and active church community that has continued to grow in membership over these last two years. With hard work, patience, and God's guidance, we will be blessed with a wonderful pastor to guide us as we continue to minister together in the name of Jesus Christ.

# Reverend Roger W. Wilmer, Jr.

Reverend Roger W. Wilmer Jr. was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to Roger W. and Jacqueline W. Wilmer. He was educated in the Philadelphia public school system before earning a degree in Surgical Technology from the Institute for the Advancement of the Medical Sciences in Cherry Hill, New Jersey. He built a distinguished career in organ donation and transplantation, serving as a Transplant Coordinator—a field he once considered his greatest passion.

Yet even in his medical career, his faith remained central. Ultimately, he came to recognize that his greatest calling was serving the Lord. Reverend Wilmer accepted Jesus Christ as his Savior at an early age under the pastorship of his grandfather, the late Reverend Dr. T.R. Washington. Raised with a strong foundation in faith, he dedicated his life to God's work. He was spiritually mentored for many years by Reverend Luke J. Robinson, Pastor of Quinn Chapel A.M.E. Church in Frederick, Maryland. It was there that he answered God's call to ministry.

Reverend Wilmer was ordained an Itinerant Deacon in the African Methodist Episcopal Church in May 2003. In 2004, he earned a Master of Divinity from Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg, and in 2005, he was ordained an Itinerant Elder. His pastoral journey began at Saint Peter's A.M.E. Church in Shippensburg, Pennsylvania, followed by appointments at Bethel A.M.E. Church in Mercersburg and St. James A.M.E. Church in Chambersburg, where he and his wife, Reverend Cheryl Wilmer, served together in ministry. In addition to his pastoral leadership, Reverend Wilmer has served as a chaplain in multiple capacities—strengthening his ability to serve and attend to those facing some of life's hardest moments.

Reverend Wilmer and his wife, Reverend Cheryl Wilmer, have shared 38 wonderful years of marriage. Together, they have two daughters, Jacqueline and Lauren. Their family has grown with the addition of their son-in-law, Evan Atkinson, and three cherished grandchildren: Jordan, Jupiter, and Kinsley.

Grateful for God's guidance, Reverend Wilmer stands firmly on the words of Matthew 28:19-20:

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the

Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.
